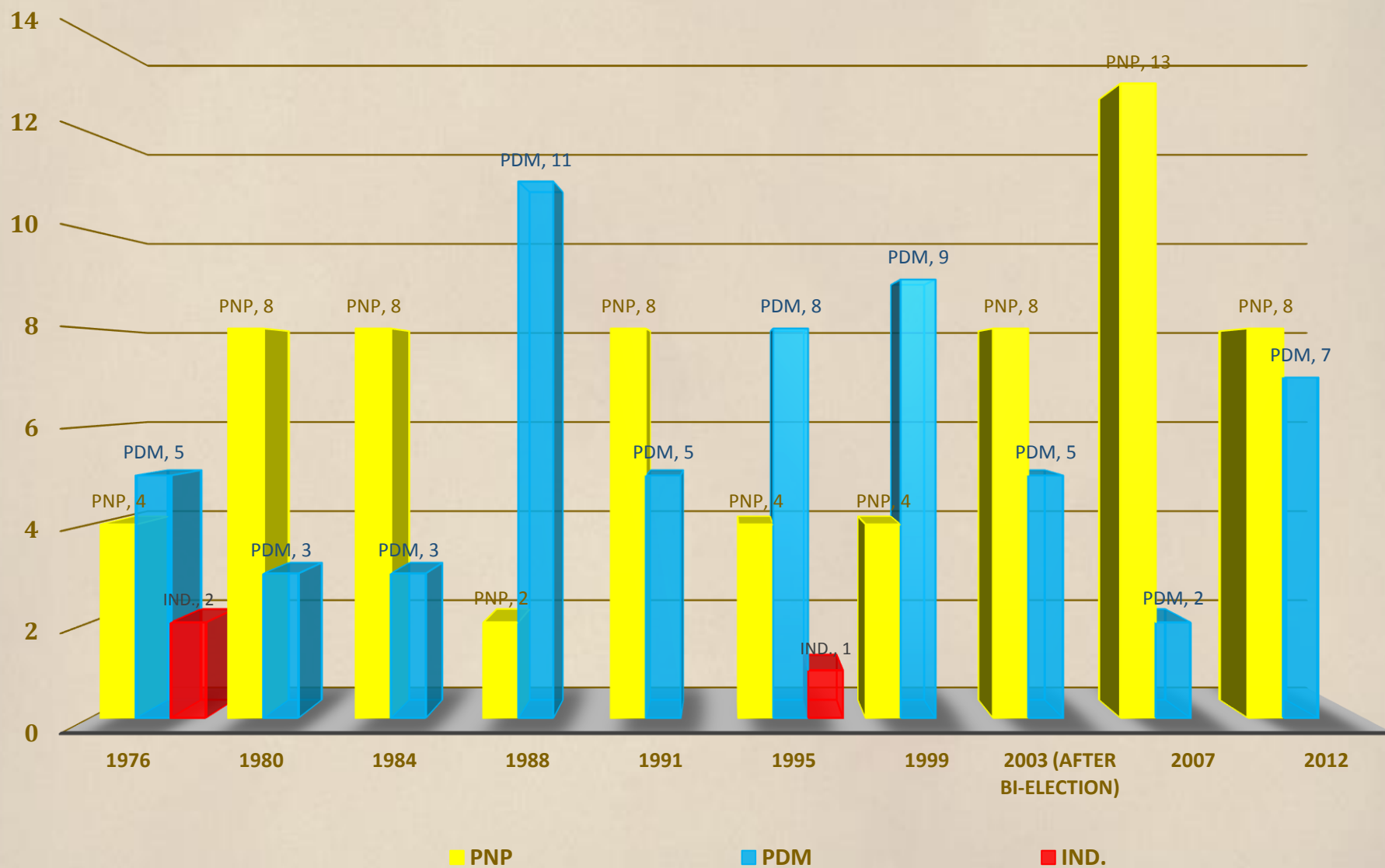

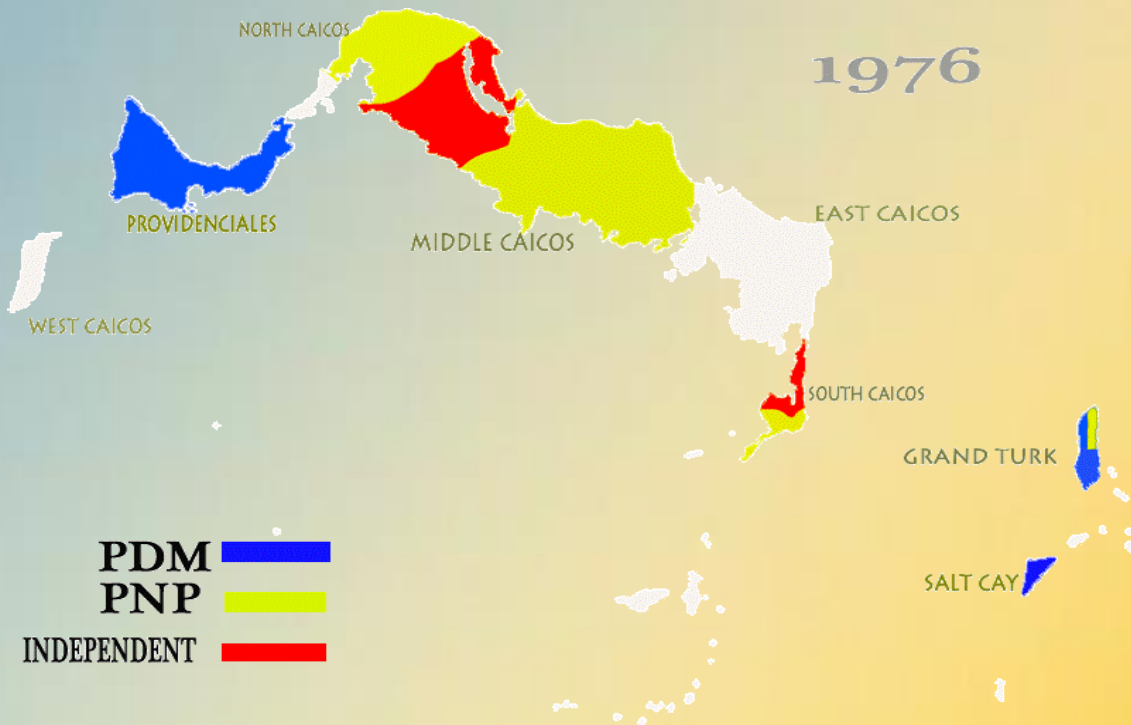

In 1973, the Junkanoo Club, a youth organization was founded by the late James A.G.S. McCartney.

Early in 1976 the Junkanoo Club, formed the Turks & Caicos second political party, the People's Democratic Movement (P.D.M.) under the leadership of the late James A.G.S. McCartney to contest the general election late in the year.

Prior to the 1976 General Election, the members of the State Council, led by the Hon. N.B. Saunders, caucus, the Progressive National Organization (PNO) to challenge the PDM.

The PDM fielded 8 candidates in the 1976 general election to contest the 11 seat legislative. It succeeded in winning 5 seats and with the help of the two independent members, it formed the first Ministerial Government of the Turks & Caicos Islands on October 5th 1976. The late James A.G.S. McCartney, the leader of the PDM, was sworn in as the Turks & Caicos Islands first Chief Minister.

In the 1976 elections the PNO fielded candidates in all 11 constituencies, winning 4 seats, in comparison to the PDM which won 5 seats.

In the 1976 General Elections, the number of registered voters ranged from 132 persons in the Sixth Electoral District, Salt Cay to 359 persons in the Eighth Electoral District, Bottle Creek. The PNO gained 1008 popular votes against the PDM 1137 popular votes.

SUMMARY OF THE 1976 GENERAL ELECTIONS

Election Highlights

1. Hon. JAGS McCartney became the first Chief Minister of the Turks and Caicos Islands.
2. The PNO won 4 of the 11 seats, the PDM won 5 seats and independent candidates won 2 seats. The two independent candidates joined with the PDM to form the government.
3. Nathaniel Francis of the PNO defeated Herbert Been in Over Back by the closest margin of 8 votes (145 – 137).
4. A total of 2,550 voters, or 85.1 percent of the electorate went to the polls.
5. The PDM won by approximately a 129 popular vote margin.
6. The second closest race occurred in Salt Cay where PDM captured 61 votes and PNO 49.
7. The greatest Majority was by Hon. Jags McCartney who defeated Alexander Smith 193 to 22.
8. Hon. Walter Cox of the PDM defeated Hilly A. Ewing of the PNO by 13 votes with a victory of 149-136.

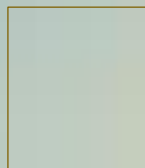

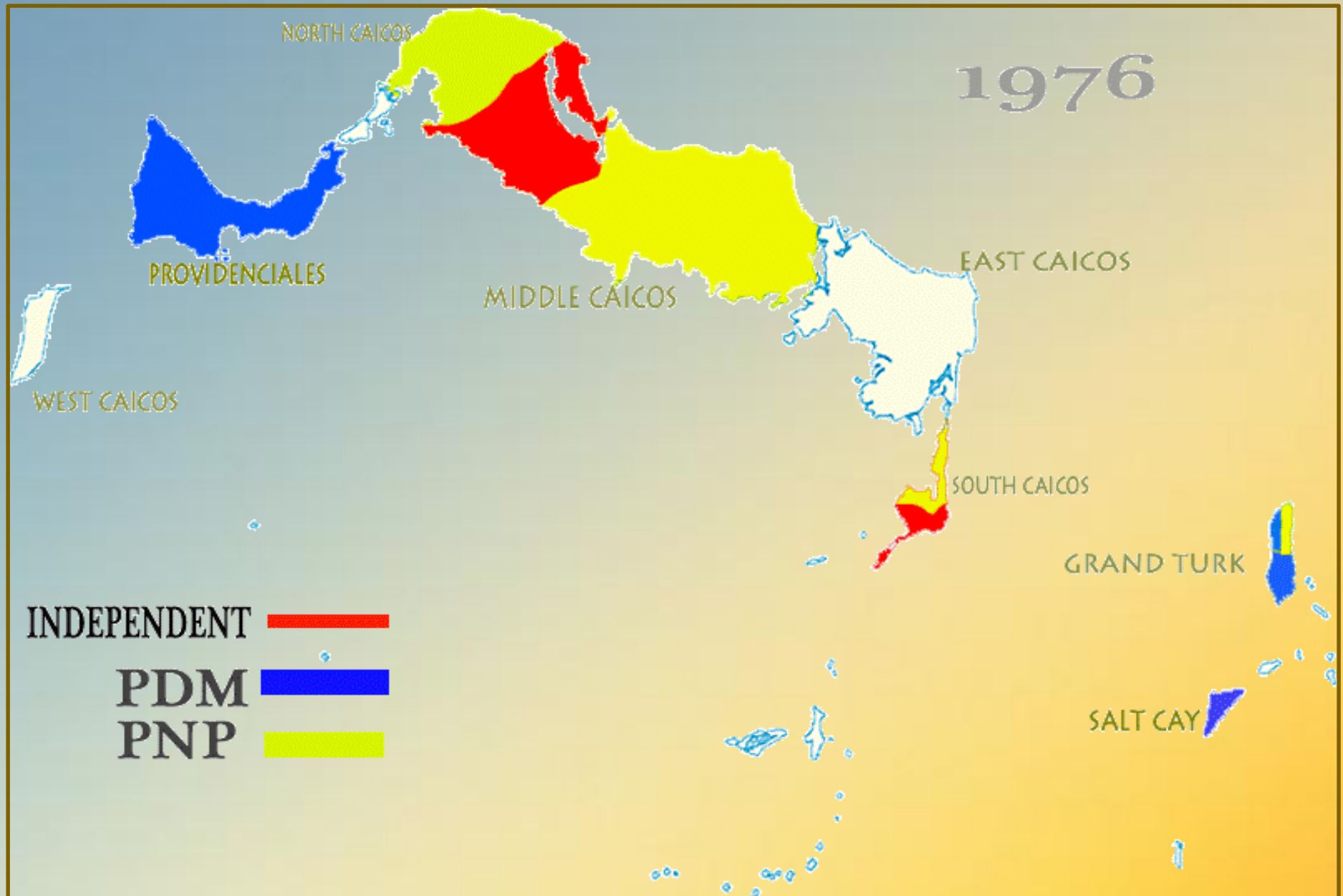

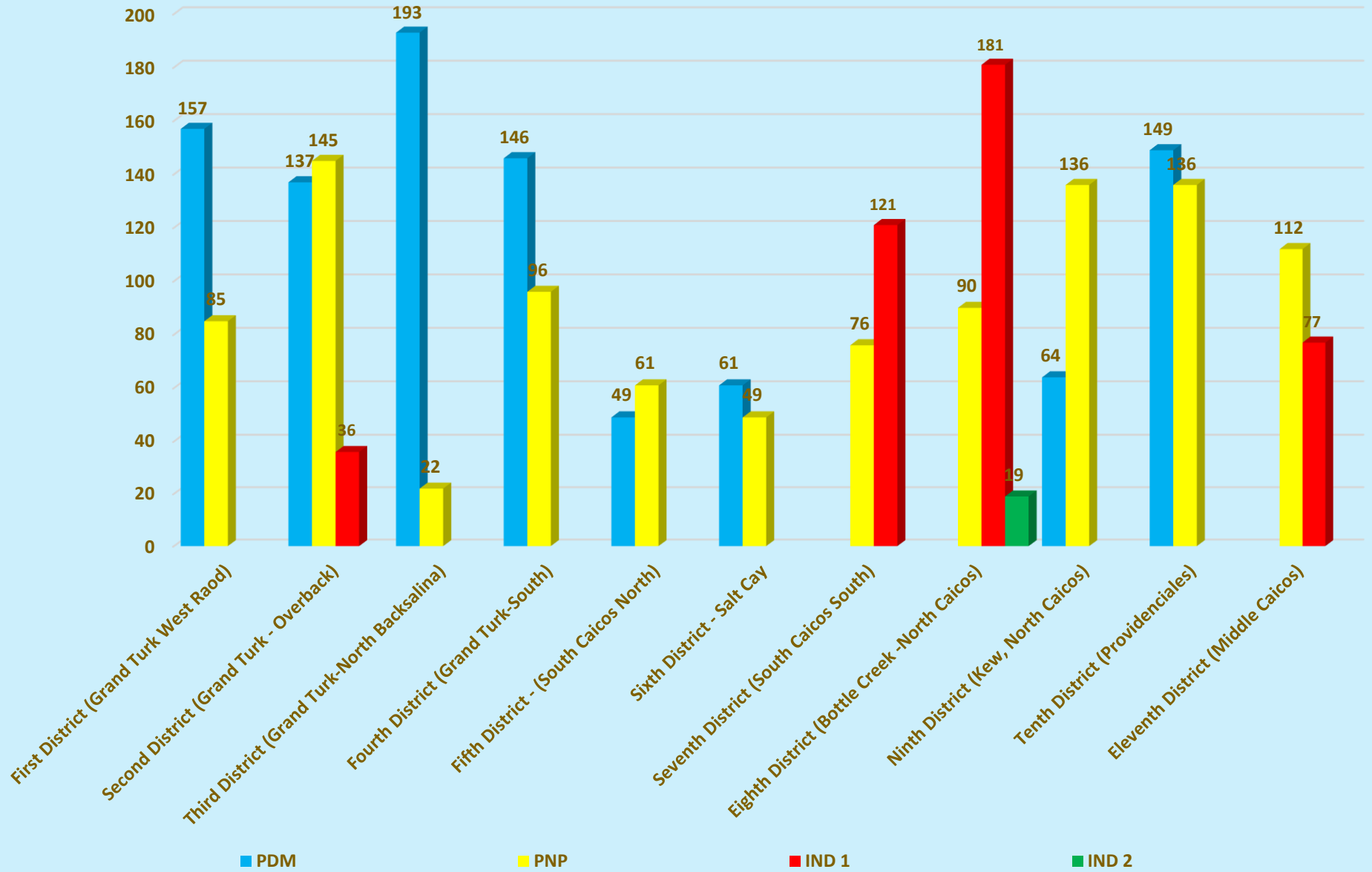
Number of seats won by Political Party and Island: 1976



MAP SHOWING PARTY WINNERS BY ISLAND: 1976.

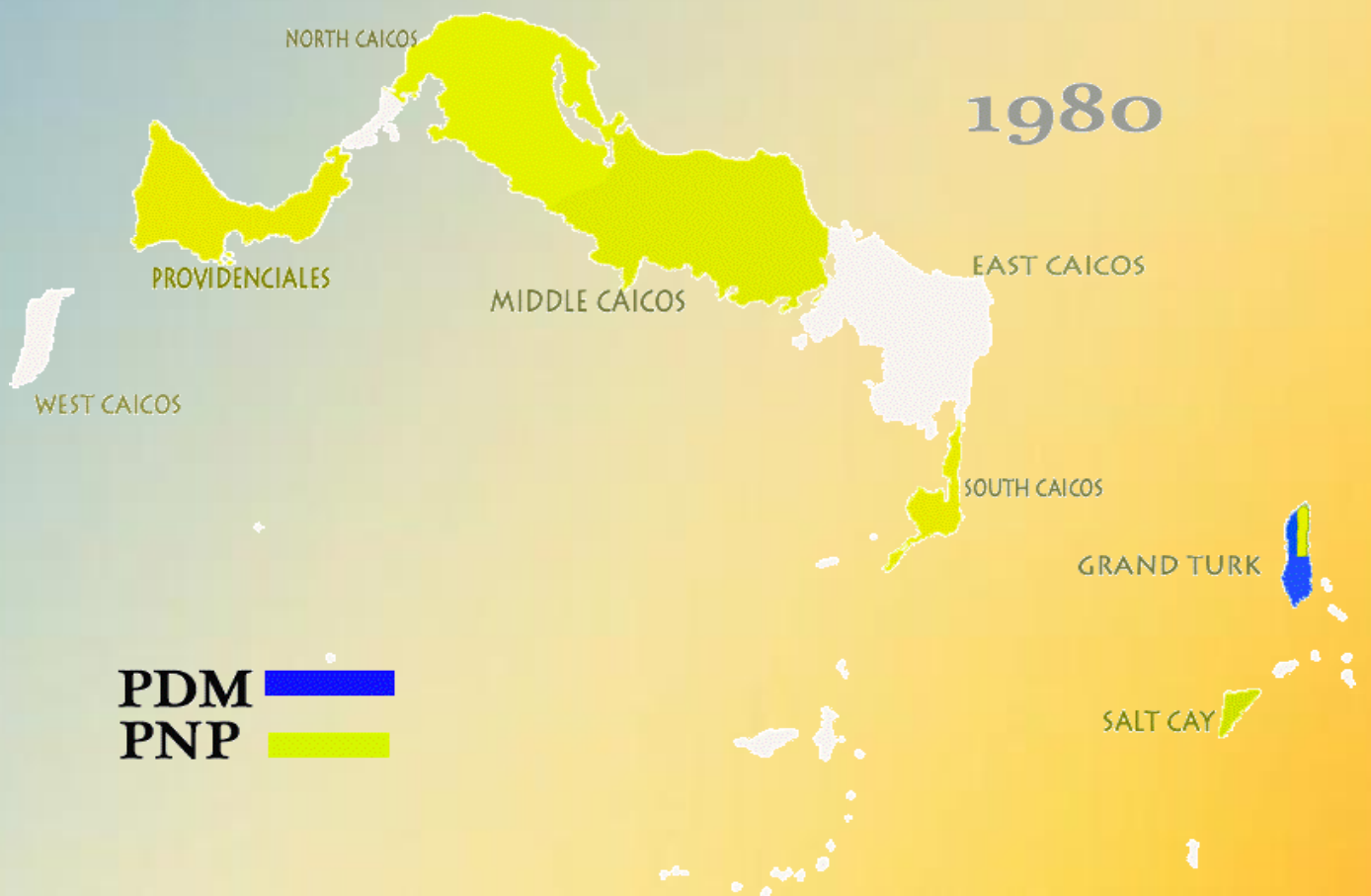


Results of the General Election by Political Party and Districts: 1976.

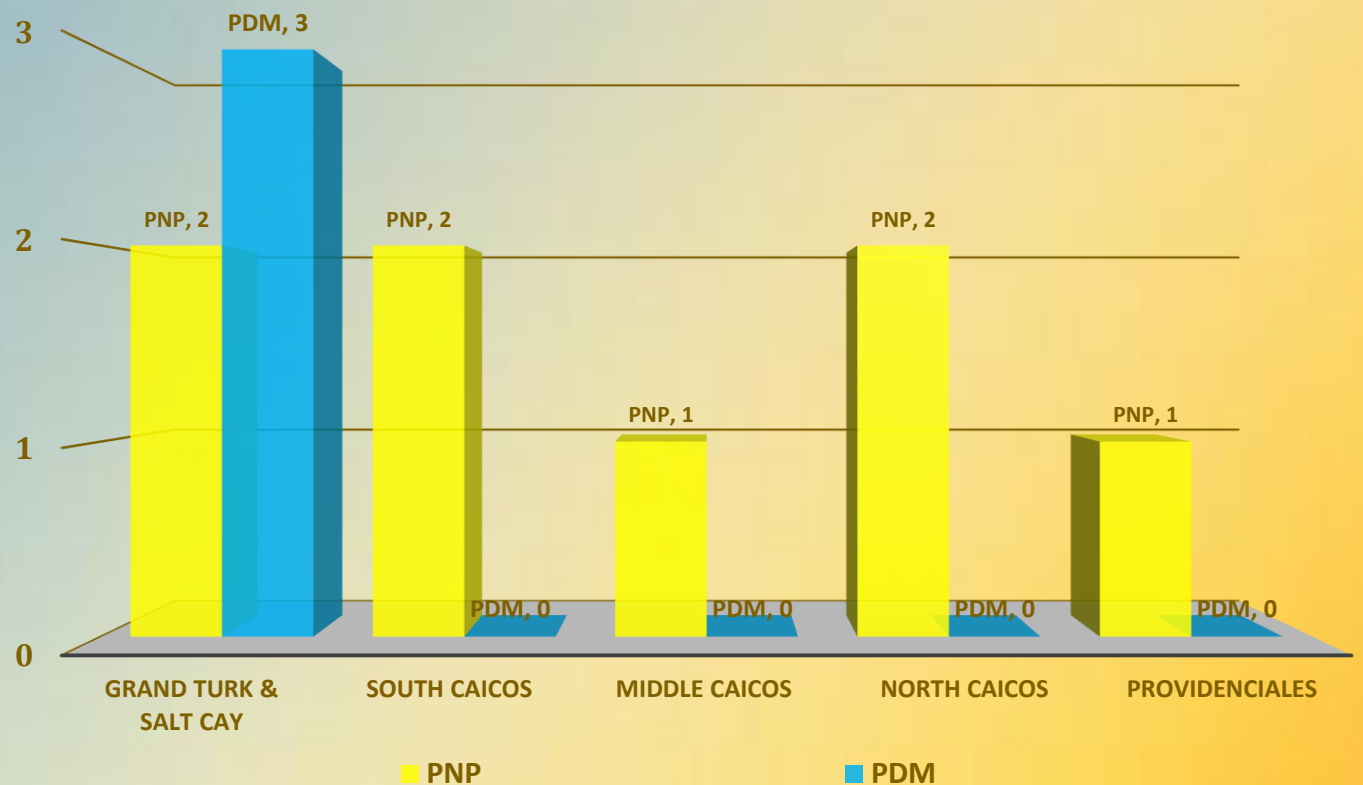
MAP SHOWING PARTY WINNERS BY ISLAND: 1980.



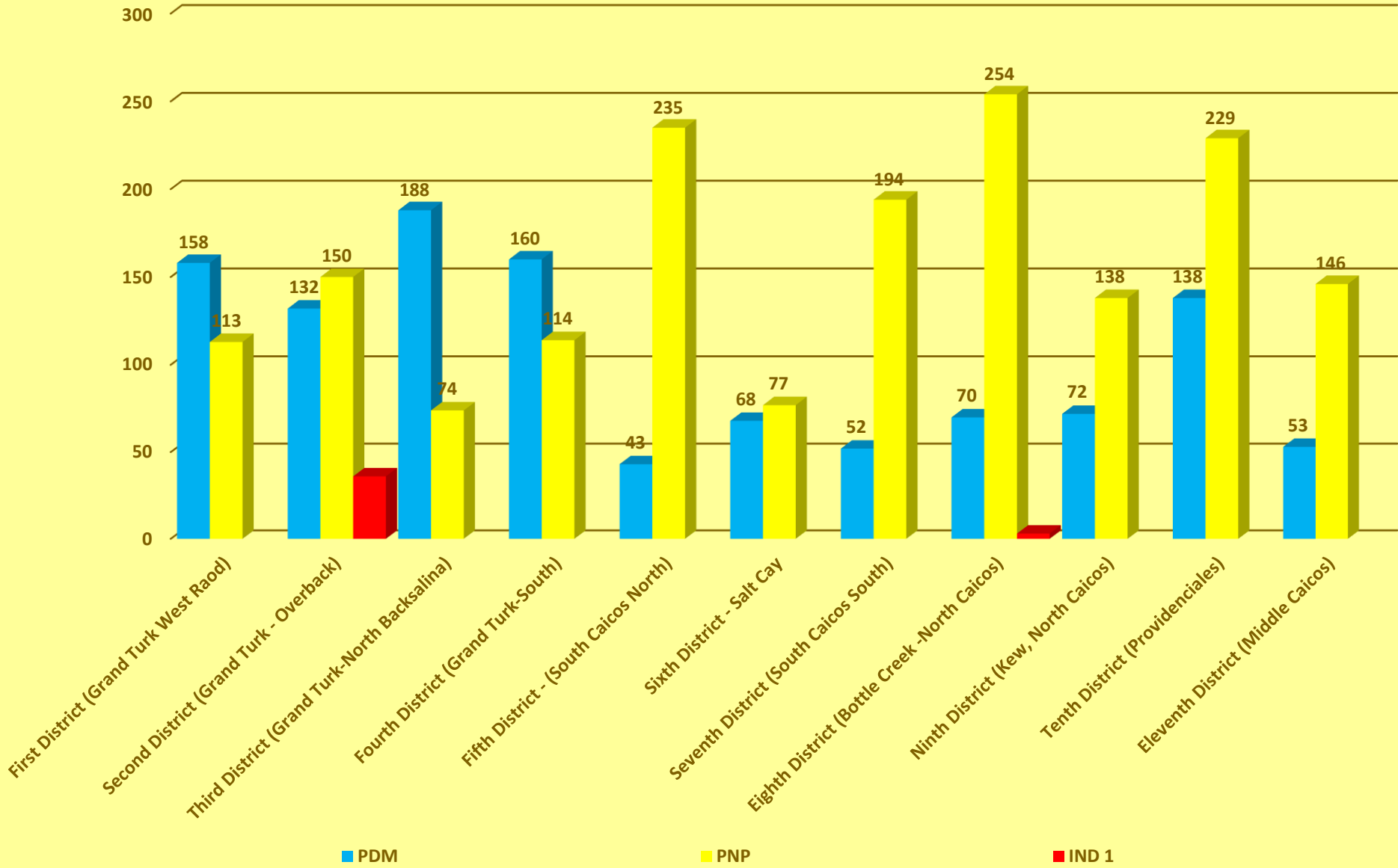

Number of seats won by Political Party and Island: 1980

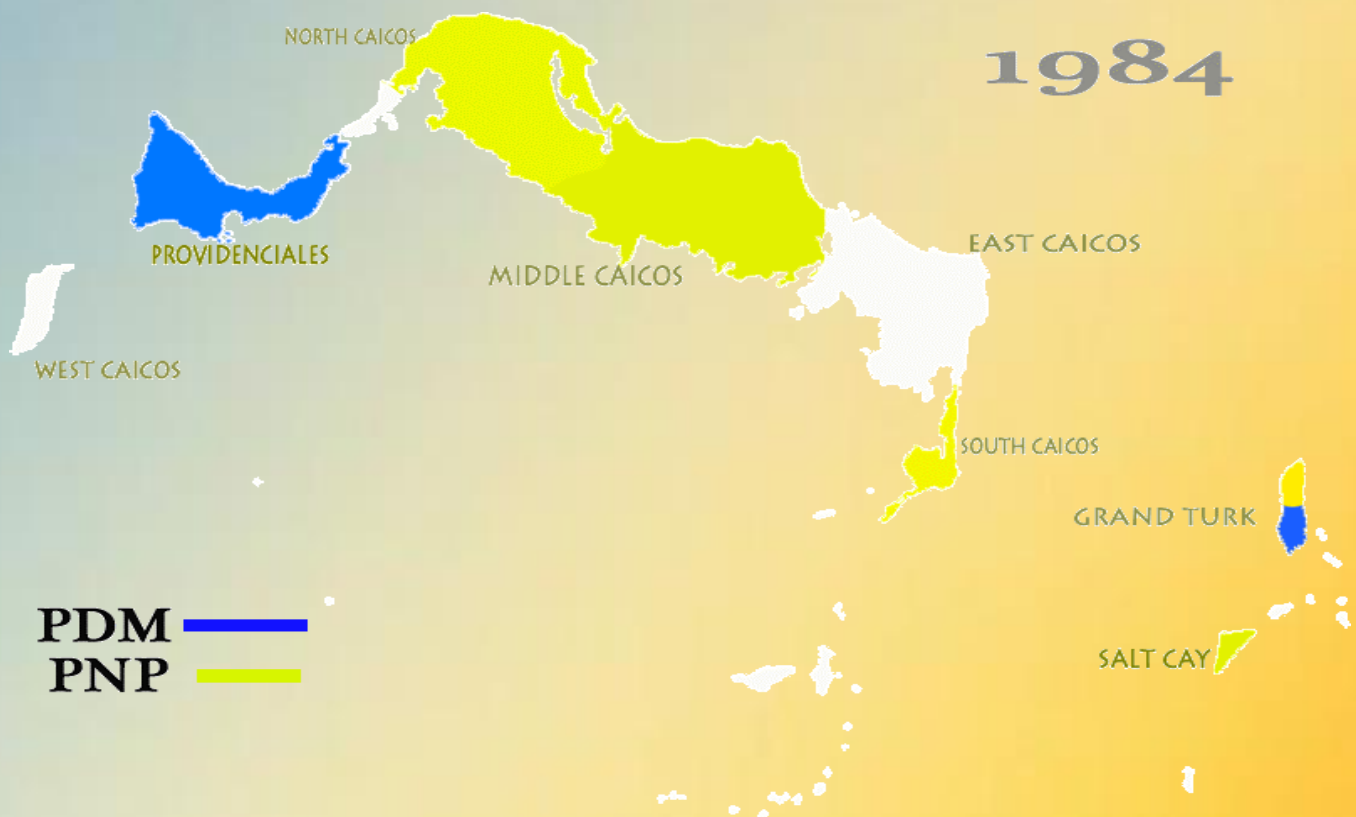


Results of the General Election by Political Party and Districts: 1980.

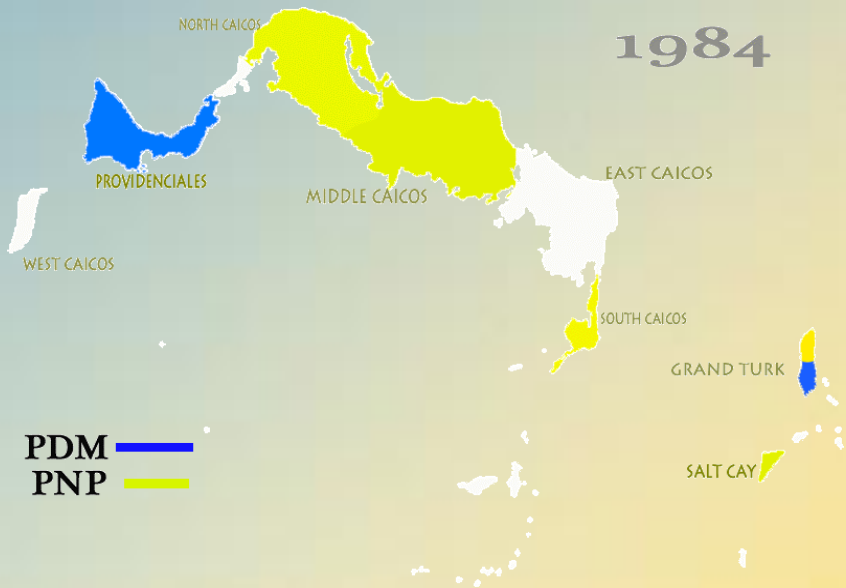

5. A total of 2,094 voters, or 88 percent of the electorate went to the polls.
6. The closest race occurred in the Grand Turk South seat where the PNP captured 192 votes to the PDM 209 votes.
7. The greatest Majority by Hon. Norman Saunders who defeated PDM Lewis Cox by a vote of 245 to 46.
8. Hon. Rosita Butterfield Became the first female elected member.

MAP SHOWING GENERAL ELECTION WINNERS BY ISLAND AND POLITICAL PARTY COLOUR: 1984.

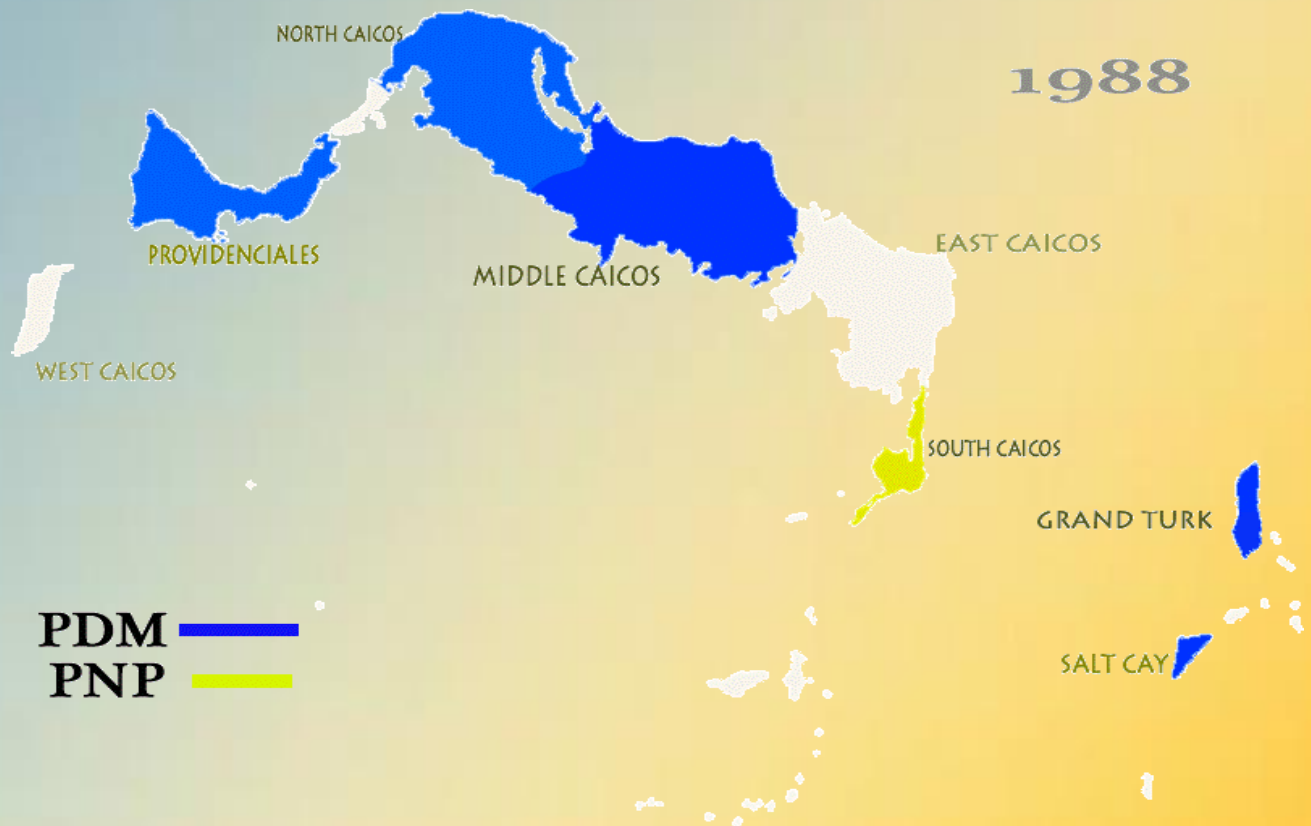

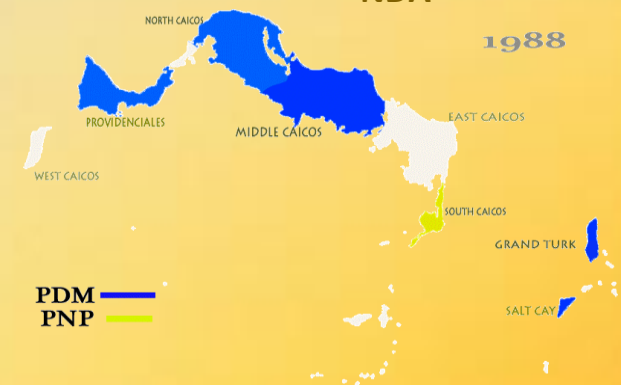

Election Highlights

1. This was the first election under the ministerial form of government in which the multi-votes constituencies was used in the Turks and Caicos Islands.
2. There were three major parties contesting the elections. These were the People's Democratic Movement (PDM), Progressive National Party (PNP) and National Democratic Alliance (NDA).
3. Hon. Oswald Skippings party (PDM) won 11 of the 13 seats and he once again became Chief Minister of the Turks and Caicos Islands after a brief stint in 1980 as a result of the death of the Honourable Jags McCartney.
4. Only Hon. Emily Saunders and Hon. Alden Durham won their seats for the PNP. Both seats were on South Caicos.
5. The National Democratic Alliance NDA did not win any seat.
6. The PDM claimed all of the seats on Grand Turk and Salt Cay, North and Middle Caicos and Providenciales.
7. A total of 3,550 voters, or 86.1 percent of the electorate went to the polls.
8. The leaders of the PNP and NDA lost their seats. This was the first time that the leader of any major political party lost a seat in a general election.

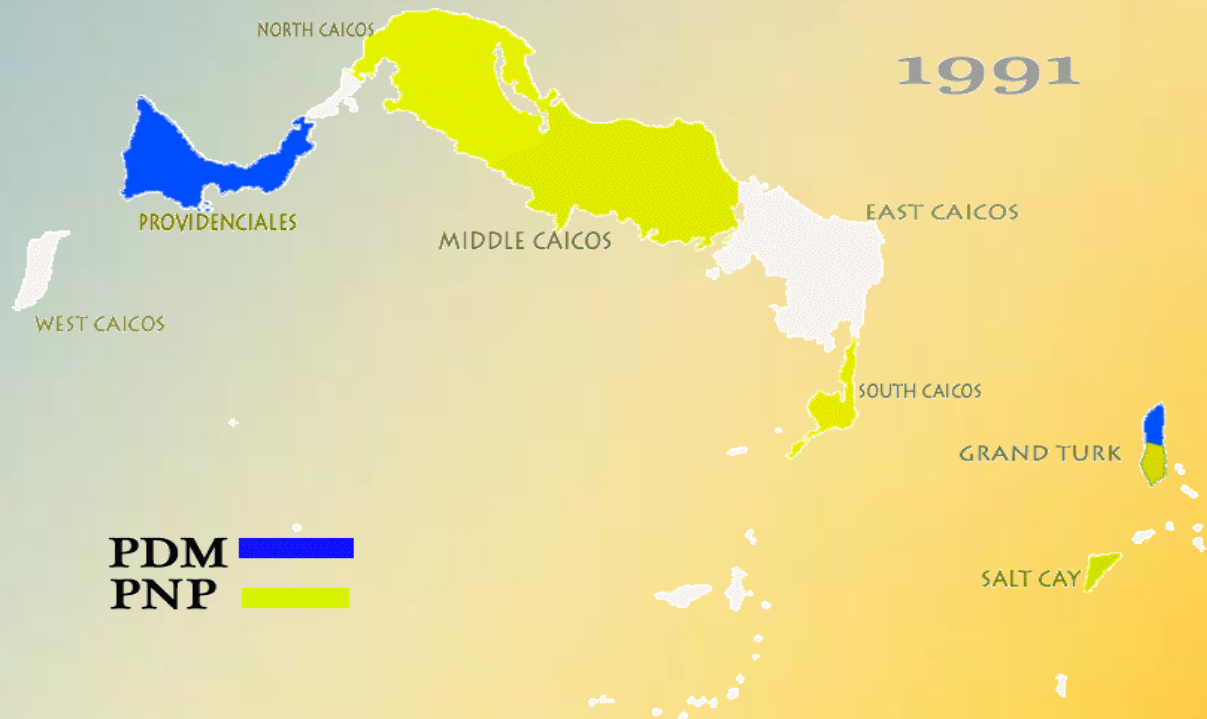

MAP SHOWING GENERAL ELECTION WINNERS BY ISLAND AND POLITICAL PARTY COLOUR: 1991.

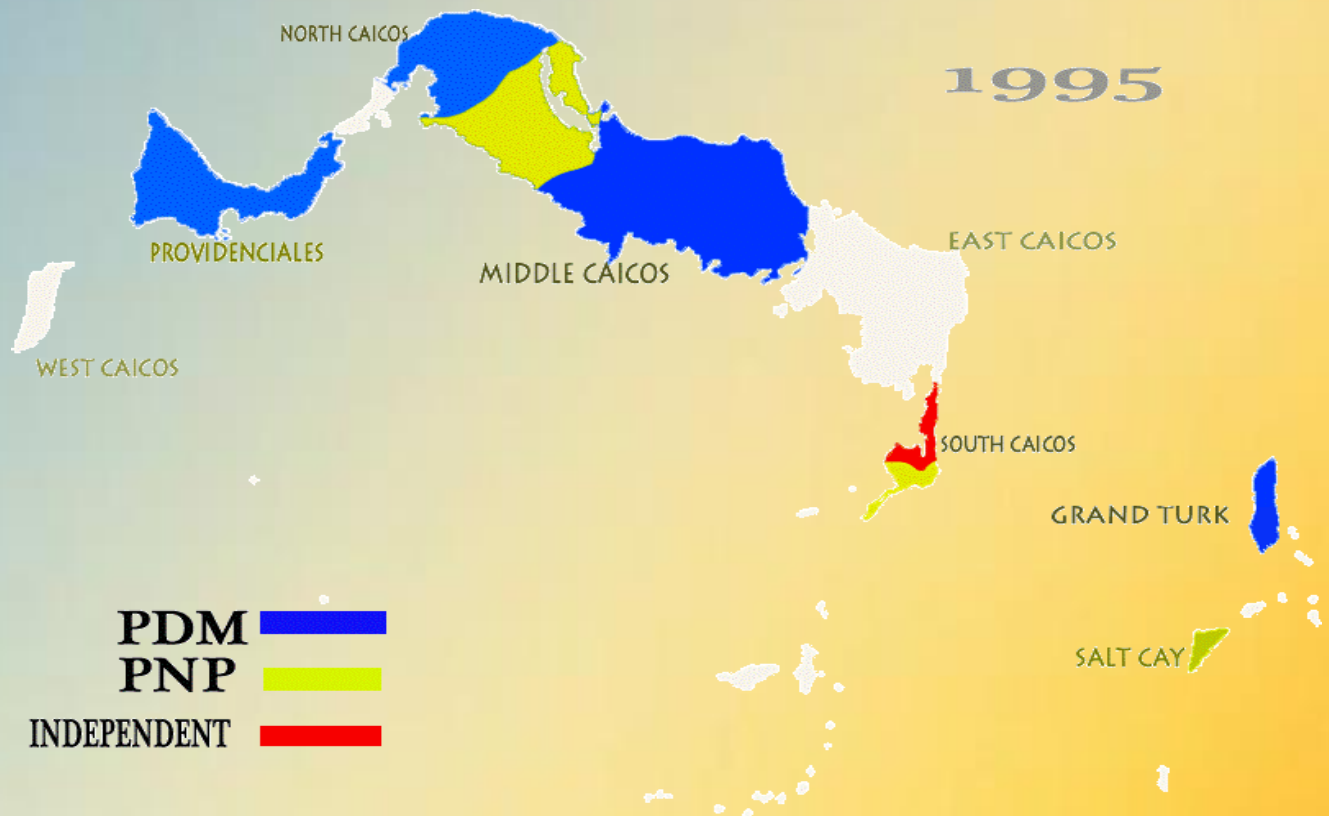


NUMBER OF SEATS WON BY POLITICAL PARTY AND ISLAND: 1991.

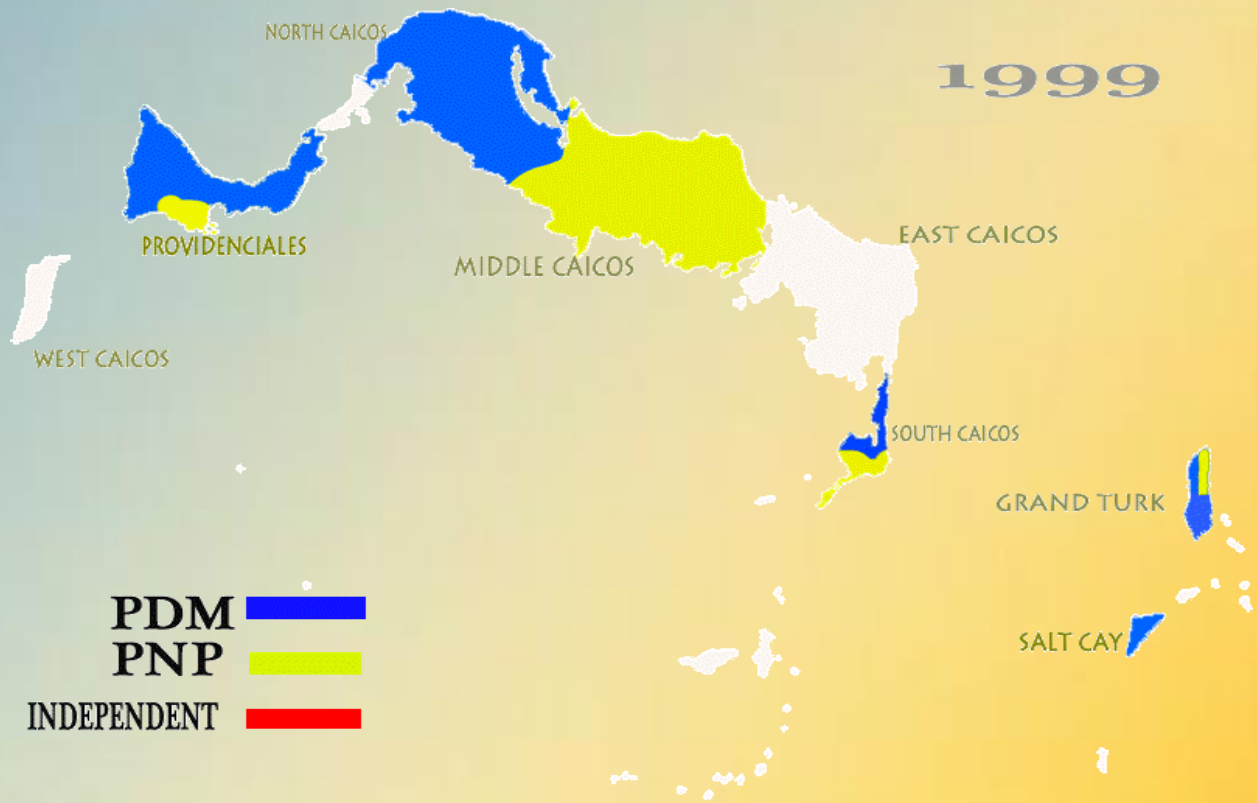


MAP SHOWING GENERAL ELECTION WINNERS BY ISLAND AND POLITICAL PARTY COLOUR: 1995.

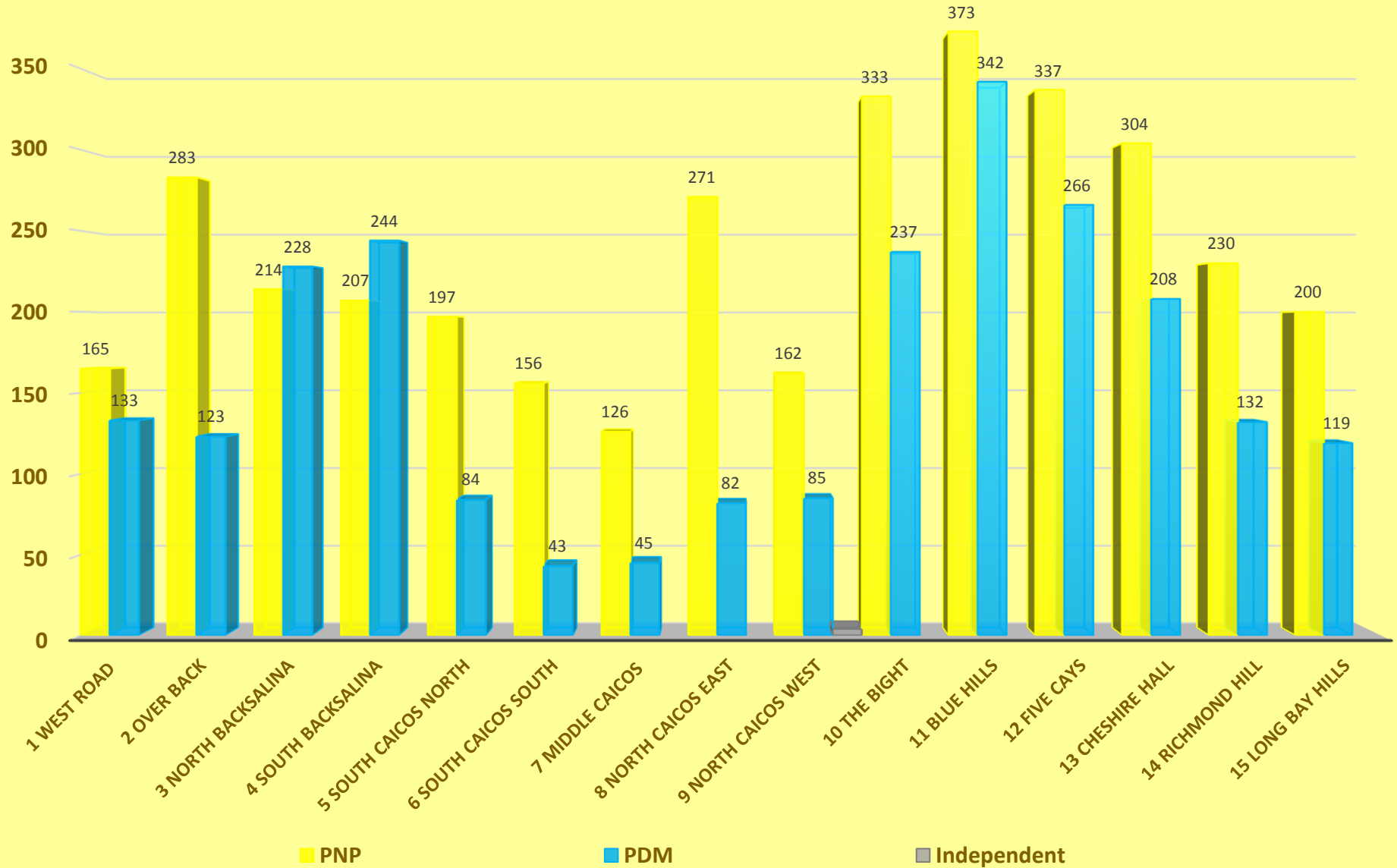
MAP SHOWING GENERAL ELECTION WINNERS BY ISLAND AND POLITICAL PARTY COLOUR: 2003.

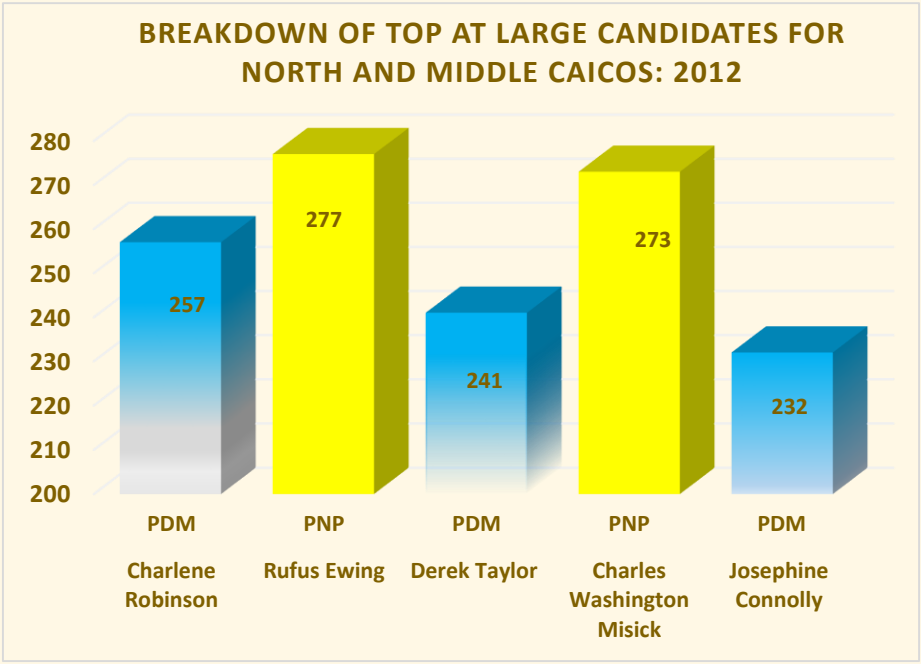
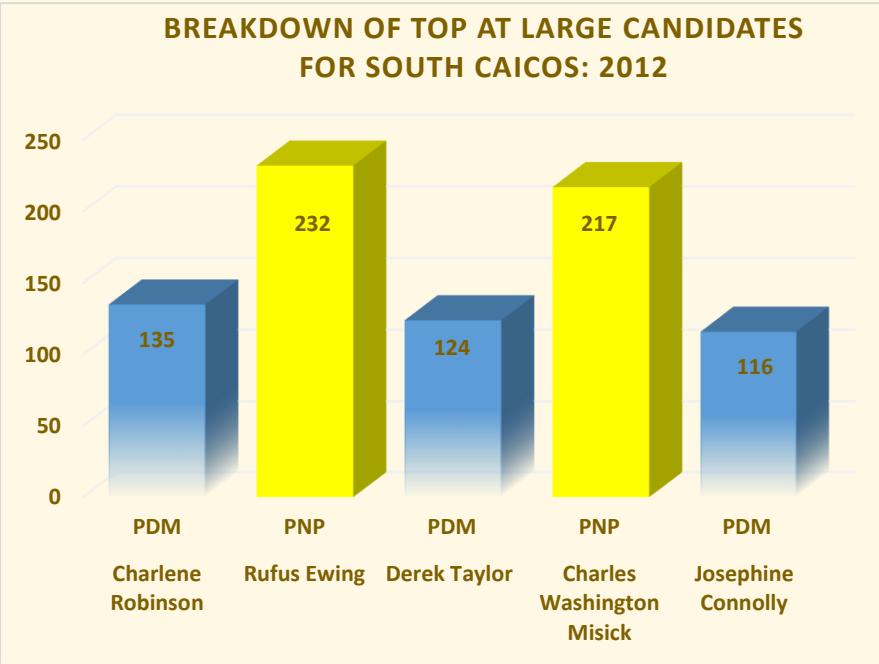
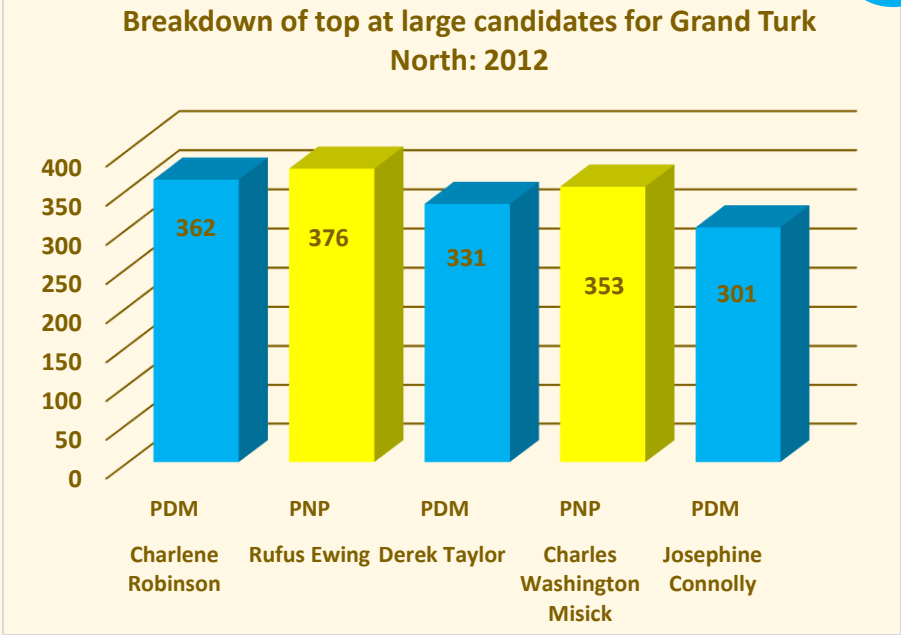
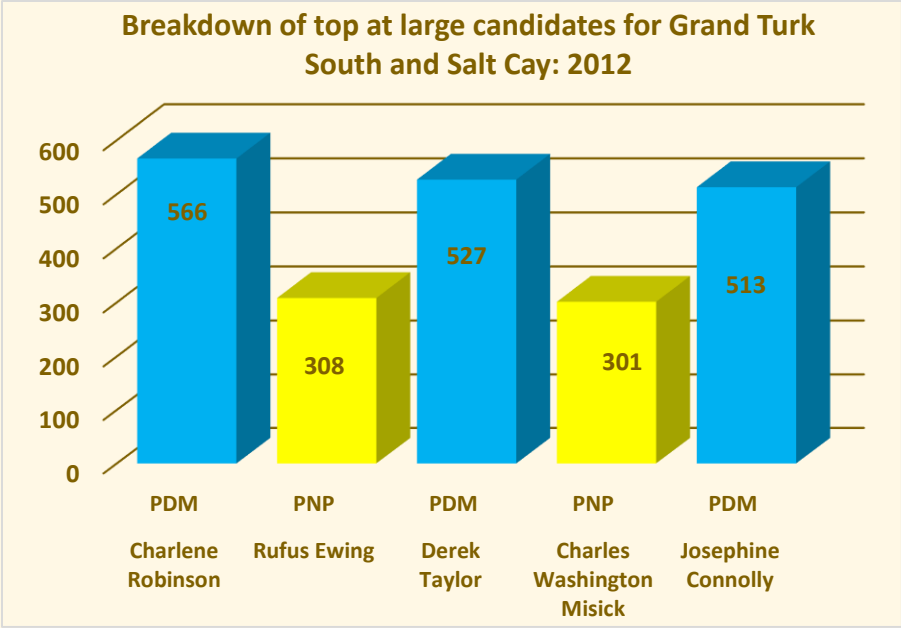


MAP SHOWING PARTY WINNERS BY ISLAND: 2012.

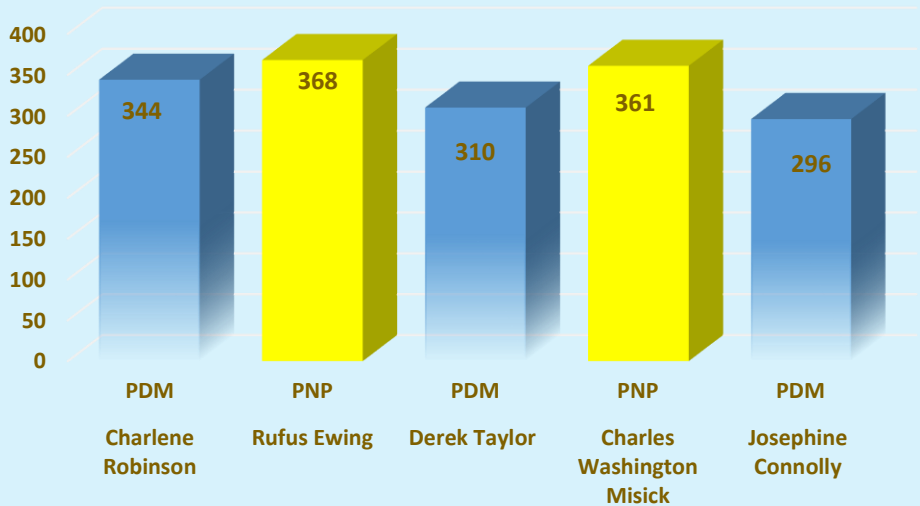


Breakdown of top at large candidates Total: 2012

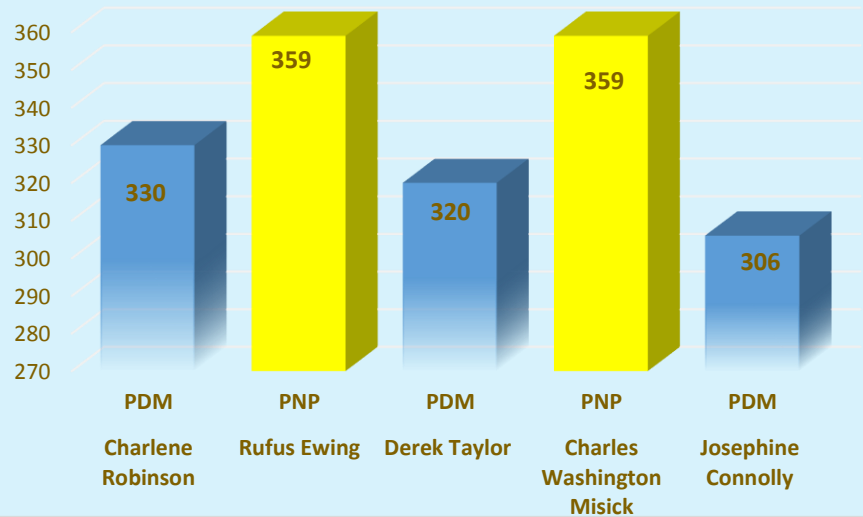




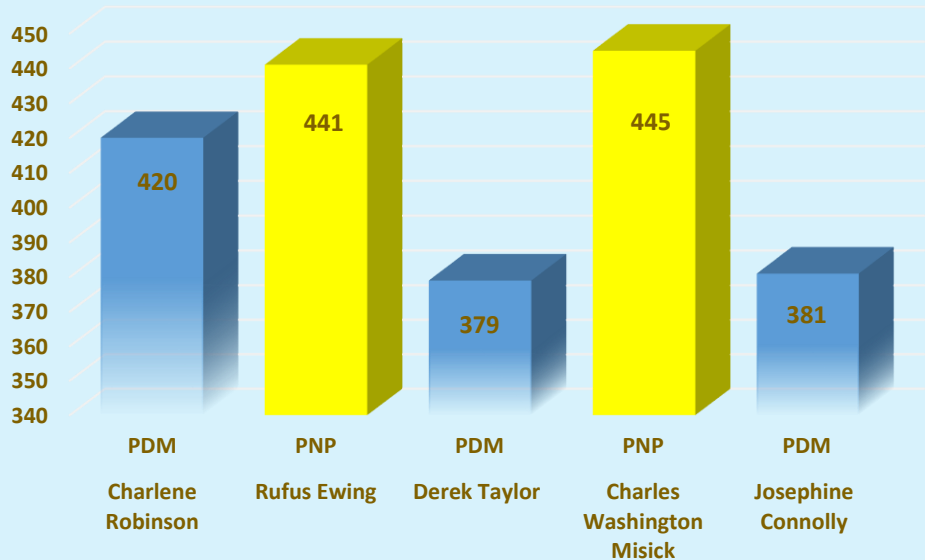

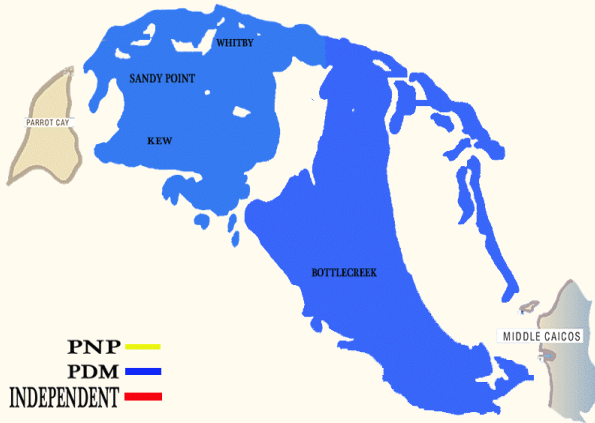
**Maps Showing Election Results by Islands:
